School Uniform

POLICY STATEMENT

St Andrew's Grammar has a conservative school uniform that reflects the values, ethos and Greek traditions of the School.

All students are expected to be dressed in the appropriate uniform for the season, term or event as outlined in the dress regulations document found on our website. We ask that all parents and guardians support the School by ensuring that their child is correctly dressed for school in the appropriate uniform of the day. Students are also expected to abide by all dress requirements with regard to personal grooming standards. Students are expected to ensure that their dress and appearance brings credit to the School and themselves.

Failure to do so will result in the imposition of sanctions up to and including suspension from school until the matter is rectified.

All parents and students have committed to upholding the uniform standards of the school during the enrolment procedures.

Requests for variations to this Policy are to be made in writing to the Principal who will refer them to the CEO of SAG Inc. The Principal will communicate to the parent the ruling from the representative of SAG Inc who is the School's governing body.

Dress Regulations

Calendar for uniform items.

- All uniform items mentioned above need to be school branded uniform items which are available at the school uniform shop (excluding shoes)
- Summer uniform is worn in Term 1 and 4.
- Winter uniform is worn in Term 2 and 3.
- There is a two-week transition period at the beginning of Term 2, to accommodate warm weather.
- Students are expected to ensure that their dress and appearance brings credit to the School and themselves.

Shirts and Blouses.

- Long sleeved shirts and jumpers are not permitted to be rolled up.
- There are two styles of shirt, as we transition, older style shirts, need to be tucked.
- Hem length of skirts and pinafore dresses to be no shorter than the top of the knee cap.
- Top button of shirts to be done up when wearing a tie.

Footwear

- Black lace-up school shoes - heel height maximum 3cm. Black leather joggers (sport shoes) are not permitted as school shoes.
- Sport shoes (track shoes) are to be predominantly white in colour.

Headwear

- School hats are required to be worn at recess, lunch and sport.
- Hats are the School branded bucket hat or the School branded cap.
- Only St Andrew's Grammar School bags may be used at the School.
- Girls from Years 1-12 who choose to wear a plain Hijab in the blue school colour may do so. However, a hat must still be worn for sports, recess and lunch. Under Head wear must be blue or white. All hijabs should be wrapped correctly.
- Sports undergarments need to be blue.

Hair

- Hair accessories must be navy, white or royal blue.
- Students' hair must be off the face and, if of collar length or longer, must be tied up.
- Dyeing of hair (of unnatural colour) and extreme hairstyles are not permitted. If a decision on extreme hairstyles is needed, it will be deferred, or their delegate, for a decision.
- Excessive amounts of gel or wax should not be placed in the hair.
- Boys are expected to be shaved at all times.

Jewellery

- Girls may wear one pair of plain ear studs or plain sleeper earrings (both ears) in the lower lobe of each ear and in no other part of the ear.
- Boys may wear one pair of plain ear stud earrings (both ears) in the lower lobe of each ear and in no other part of the ear.
- Any other form of piercing or jewellery is not permissible.
- Optional jewellery includes a watch and a cross or religious medallion - chain must not be visible. Students of the Christian Orthodox faith may wear a single black prayer rope bracelet.
- Nails are not permitted to extend beyond the fingertip. Nail polish is not permitted.
- Make-up, if used, should be natural. If a decision on make-up is needed, it will be deferred, or their delegate, for a decision.
